Dear Brothers and Sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes,

The news of our Savior's arrest and death on the eve and day of Good Friday spread quickly. Within a few hours, nearly all the disciples had scattered. Peter, meanwhile, was denying (removing) all his links online and offline. For a while, he desired that none of this would be available to those who might search among the media and watchers of his day.

Whether they were only watchers or truly holy ones, these included the city crowd, the women of Jerusalem, the Roman soldiers, our Blessed Mother and the disciple John. They witnessed his death, taking his body from the Cross. Though this was not very good news at first, was this not well publicized?

The publicity of Good Friday differs from the private appearances of Easter Sunday.

Was this news of the resurrection reported inefficiently? John Henry Newman asked, "Why did not our Savior show himself to all the people?" (J.H. Newman, Book 1, Sermon 22, "Witnesses of the Resurrection", *Parochial and Plain Sermons*) Newman answered that while an appearance in downtown Jerusalem or uptown Rome would have attracted attention, the show would have been over quickly. "They might have been startled at the time, but why should this amazement last?" (Newman, Book I, Sermon 22)

Rather, Jesus appeared to a small group of disciples. He also appears to us in simpler and intimate ways to build a relationship. I invite you, this Easter Season, to be alert to this presence in your joys and struggles. Pray regularly before the Blessed Sacrament in the Tabernacle as we did on Holy Thursday. The Lord is present in our joys and struggles, especially when death or illness touches us. We may not have the words to say. Yet, in time, the Lord also visits us with news of the Resurrection.

We are invited, then, to wait for his word, his inspiration. Easter reminds us to trust that he can roll away stones of doubt, of sinfulness and division and can bring us joy amid sacrifice and service. We are called to construct our lives with his help and direction:

"The stone which the builders rejected has become the cornerstone. This is the Lord's doing; it is marvelous in our eyes. This is the day which the Lord has made: let us rejoice and be glad in it." (Psalm 118:22-24)
