Dear Brothers and Sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes,

By the time our Savior has gone and risen from the tomb, the disciples are on a new journey to a familiar locale: Galilee. They are sent to encounter and find our Savior in the place where they first met him.

Many of our most important relationships and projects are initiated because we step outside of ourselves, away from our agendas, and in the opposite direction of the popular center. Jerusalem is the significant destination for the mission of our Savior. However, many of his miracles and encounters occur neither uptown nor downtown but out of town: Nazareth, Cana, Capernaum.

While the youth, Jesus, makes a cameo-celebrity appearance as the impressive Jerusalem Apprentice at age 12, he gathers his disciples off the set and away from the official authorities. However, he is establishing a connection with his disciples – with you and me – so that he can enter our lives and be our center and our support.

As John Henry Cardinal Newman (1801-1890) wrote, "It might have been expected, that, on our Saviour's rising again from the dead, He would have shown Himself to very great numbers." (John Henry Newman, "Witnesses of the Resurrection" *Parochial & Plain Sermons*) But, what we know is that he only shows himself to selected friends and to those who knew him.

Perhaps, Christ could have spread the Resurrection News more effectively with wider distribution on more device and channels. After all, the route to Calvary – in Jerusalem -- was perceptible with all who had eyes to see and ears to hear. Why should the stone of the tomb be rolled away without cameras rolling?

The answer has to do with the intimacy and relationship to which we are all called in God's plan. Lack of notoriety does not mean the Resurrection lacks importance.

The silence of the Resurrection accords with many of Christ's other miracles which were not witnessed by the crowd or understood by the larger multitude until later.

Pope Francis reminds us, similarly, to return to Galilee in our faith and our relationships. For example, we have experienced the call of God to love others, to take responsibility not only because of what is popular or well known but because of a personal out-of-the-way encounter. Great friendships and loving relationships often start this way. We are called to see what others may not.

Our Holy Father writes:

"In the life of every Christian, after baptism there is also another "Galilee", a more existential "Galilee": the experience of a personal encounter with Jesus Christ who called me to follow him and to share in his mission. In this sense, returning to Galilee means treasuring in my heart the living memory of that call, when Jesus passed my way, gazed at me with mercy and asked me to follow him. To return there means reviving the memory of that moment when his eyes met mine, the moment when he made me realize that he loved me." (Pope Francis, Vatican Basilica, Holy Saturday, 19 April 2014)

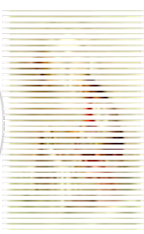
