Ginny Kubitz Moyer's book, Mary and Me offers a contemporary women's experience of the Blessed Mother (Part 2 of 2)

For many young women, their sense of Mary, mother of Jesus, is relatively one-dimensional. They recall a humble, pious woman who was submissive to both her husband and her God. Or she's the woman in blue whom we crown with roses every May and who adorns our gardens peacefully. The modern female, it might seem, would have little in common with a woman who seems so out of touch with contemporary life.

Ginny Kubitz Moyer's book, *Mary and Me* (St. Anthony Messenger Press, Jan. 2008) shatters all those presumptions by compiling reflections and stories from 46 modern women of all ages about their relationships with Mary. While the author uses traditional Marian titles like "Our Lady of Sorrows" throughout the book, they function as subtle connectors between the time-honored depiction of Mary and the rich, varied and modern situations in which the women she features have experienced her. The overall effect is of an intimate gathering that allows readers to feel like they're with friends sharing spiritual yarns.

Mary and Me is filled with these types of tales: some funny, some tragic and some incredibly touching. The image of the Visitation, where Mary goes to meet her cousin Elizabeth is ripe for a 14-year veteran counselor and religious sister's spiritual sustenance. She now calls the

one-on-one experience of conducting therapy sessions with her clients "The Mary and Elizabeth thing."

"In the depths of your heart, you can achieve what you want to get, but we can't do it by ourselves—it's not solitary" she says. "We can be Mary to Elizabeth, or we can be Elizabeth embracing Mary, either one – but it's in that moment that we enable one another to stay the course, to do the hard thing, to do what we know needs doing." She acknowledges that it's not always easy; sometimes these encounters involve reaching beyond our own comfort zones. "Human beings can touch the heart of one another, but they have to give up something of themselves to do that. They have to take a risk sometimes to challenge the other, to disappoint the other in some way. It's in those moments that I think God is within us."

Naturally the experience of Motherhood takes center stage and allows the women and the author to reflect on their experience of having and being a mother. For some, the experience of having a mother who was a strong nurturer brings them into that same comforting relationship with the blessed mother. They often find their strength and renewal in that relationship. For others, the pain of having a distant mother leaves them cold and unable to love Mary openly, at least at first. Finding their way to Mary becomes an enabling mission in which old hurts are healed and new courage takes hold, to the point where one says she can finally see herself as a mother for the first time.

<u>Date of the Solemnity of Ascension</u> <u>Transferred to Sunday May 29</u>

The Bishops of New Jersey have permanently transferred the observance of the **Ascension of the Lord** to the following Sunday which is currently listed as the "7th Sunday of Easter."

In 2022, the Ascension of the Lord will be celebrated on Sunday, May 29, with its vigil on the evening of Saturday, May 28. (This is U.S. Memorial Day Weekend in 2022).

NOTE TO LECTORS: This means that the actual biblical readings at Sunday Mass on May 28-29 may now be found in your Lector's Workbook on pages 181-184 on the pages for "Ascension of the Lord." The Second Reading has 2 options. Please prepare both, just in case, the second option is selected. Readings for Mass, for the congregation will come from Gather #967.

On Thursday May 26, there will be 1 Morning Mass at 8:30 am celebrating the Memorial of St. Philip Neri.

2022-2023 REGISTRATION (Classes start September 2022)

FAMILY CATECHESIS - GRADES 1 - 5

Family Classes are on Saturday afternoon 3:00 - 5:30pm OR Monday night 5:00 - 7:30pm and selected Sunday mornings, including Sunday Mass, and meet once a month. Parent/Guardian must attend with child.

GRADE 6

Classes are on Wednesday nights 6:30 - 7:30pm and selected Sunday mornings*, including Sunday Mass, and meet twice a month.

MIDDLE/HIGH SCHOOL - GRADES 7 - 12

Classes are on Monday night 7:00 - 8:30pm and selected Sunday mornings 9:30 - 11:30am, including Sunday Mass. Classes meet weekly.

SACRAMENT PREPARATION - 2 year policy*



Children should begin Religious Education in Grade 1 to help them prepare for the Sacraments of First Penance and First Communion in the spring of Grade 2. It is required for a child to complete 2 years of Religious Education, regardless of their age/grade, before receiving these sacraments.



Preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation is a 2 year process which begins in Grade 7 and celebrated in the fall of Grade 9.

*Estimated date for Sacraments may change due to actual attendance.

*Parents in grades 6-12 are requested to attend the 1st and 2nd class on the schedule.
