MISSION STATEMENT The people of God in West Orange were called by the Holy Spirit in 1914 to form Our Lady of Lourdes Parish, a community centered on Jesus Christ. The Holy Spirit remains with us today as we continue our journey to God. We are inspired by the Gospel of Jesus Christ, nourished by the Eucharist, called to respect life and proclaim our Catholic faith. We serve God by providing spiritual, educational, and social activities for our parish family as well as extending God's love and compassion to serve the greater community.

Dear Brothers and Sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes,

Our biblical readings this Sunday remind us that we are called to faithfulness and perseverance.

And, our faith in God is meant to go beyond the everyday sense of a "belief" which may be one's personal opinion. The Gospel is calling us not simply to believe but also to belong.

Saint Teresa of Avila wrote: "Prayer is nothing else than being on terms of friendship with God." We are called to trust in God's ways. I share with you some of the lessons from the readings of this Sunday, in these key words from each reading: **READINESS**, **REJOICING**, **REALIZATION**, **RESOLVE**.

[READINESS] 1st Reading. Wisdom 18:6-9. "Just as you punished our adversaries, you glorified us whom you had summoned." One significant daily sacrifice - a mortification - we can make is to be punctual, to be on time. It's a worthy sacrifice because being "on time" does not call attention to our efforts. It is an act of humility to be "ready" and to be on time. St. Paul wrote: "Watch carefully how you live, not as foolish persons but as wise, making the most of the opportunity, because the days are evil." (Ephesians 5:15-16) The Book of Wisdom recalls the preparedness of the Hebrew people at the original Passover in Egypt, when they were both worshiping and praying and readying themselves for their Exodus journey.

[REJOICING] Psalm 33. "Blessed the people the Lord has chosen to be his own." Driving to an unfamiliar and/or big city, you may feel immediately uncomfortable or afraid because you do not know where to park your car. Sometimes,

the signs and directions for parking are unclear or contradictory. Perhaps we can sympathize with sign designers / writers because they have to communicate much information in a small space. The 33rd psalm reminds that God has not made us to be limited to a particular "lane" or "space", but that his commandments provide guidance wherever we are. Knowledge of God's commandments comes about not only by the way we act in large demonstrative ways, but also how we behave in our own private lives and behind the scenes. God's commandments are celebrated not only as words of justice but also of joy.

[REALIZATION] Hebrews 11:1-2, 8-19.

"Abraham looked forward to the city whose architect and maker is God." To gain your attention and your money - every seller from TARGET to TESLA - asks and answers these questions: "why us?" and "why now?" Sellers try to reduce their message length, often with a maximum of 150 characters. This is optimized not only to connect to you, the searcher, but also to the search engine (e.g., Google). The New Testament Letter to the Hebrews strived to condense the biblical message of salvation to one book. The hearers and readers of the original letter were Jewish-Christian converts for whom Abraham and Isaac were their devout ancestors. The letter to the Hebrews makes many references to the Old Testament to answer the question of why Jesus has come now and why he urges us to belong to Him.

[RESOLVE] <u>Luke 12:32-48. "You also must be prepared."</u> Derek Redmond of Great Britain, won the Gold Medal in the 4 x 400 meter relay in the 1991 World Championships, defeating the heavily favored American team and nearly

setting a new world record. Redmond is, however, best remembered for a defeat. At the 1992 Barcelona Olympics 400 meter semi-final, Redmond pulled up with a torn hamstring. As his opponents sprinted forward, Redmond limped at a slow pace, determined to reach the finish line. He was "vigilant" and resolved in the Gospel sense. Being vigilant does not necessarily mean that we are winning awards or recognized widely. We also are not lone rangers. Redmond, as he hobbled in his lane, was met by Olympics personnel but rebuffed all of them. Then, from the crowd, Redmond's own father appeared and supported his son all the way to the end. Officially in the 400 meters at Barcelona, Redmond was "disqualified" and "did not finish" due to outside assistance. However, the incident is one that shows courage and perseverance. It also shows that resolve calls us not only to do for ourselves but also accept help offered to us. (FYI - Derek Redmond video can be found via Google = "1992 Olympics Derek Redmond").
