MISSION STATEMENT The people of God in West Orange were called by the Holy Spirit in 1914 to form Our Lady of Lourdes Parish, a community centered on Jesus Christ. The Holy Spirit remains with us today as we continue our journey to God. We are inspired by the Gospel of Jesus Christ, nourished by the Eucharist, called to respect life and proclaim our Catholic faith. We serve God by providing spiritual, educational, and social activities for our parish family as well as extending God's love and compassion to serve the greater community.



Dear Brothers and Sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes,

In last Sunday's Feast of Pentecost and this Sunday's Feast of the Holy Trinity, we recall the endurance of God's presence among us.

Cardinal Joseph Bernardin, in a series of reflections on the Stations of the Cross, wrote that the Resurrection is Christ's gift of presence. We are called to testify to this presence, through reflection our own experience: "Although we are not witnesses to the risen Lord in precisely the same way as Peter and the other disciples, we have experienced foretastes of resurrection, we have experienced the presence of Jesus in our lives in so many ways."

Of course, the original disciples of Galilee had the benefit of our Savior's personal appearance. Yet, even they also were called to make the connection between his appearance and their lives. Peter, having denied three times, had to be asked three times, "Do you love me?" (John 21:15)

The American philosopher and educational reformer John Dewey wrote, "We do not learn from experience... we learn from reflecting on experience." The disciples – and you and I – are called to consider and reflect on our experience in prayer.

Cardinal Bernardin offered these examples of our own persistence, faith and reflection. In this way, we also become witnesses to the resurrection and to the Holy Spirit, in these struggles and journeys:

"Our ability to survive and keep trusting after the death of a loved one or after we have experienced some other psychological trauma; our passage from ignorance, bias, and intellectual narrowness to greater insight, broader acceptance, and more openness; our human capacity to hope and to protest human misery and suffering." (Joseph Bernardin, *The Journey to Peace*, New York: Doubleday, 2001, pp. 147-148)

Through reflection on our own experiences and struggles, we also grow in friendship and intimacy with our Savor. Pope Benedict XVI reminds us of the gladness of the disciples at the resurrection. This was not only because of the reunion but because of the conquest over death. The Passion and Resurrection of Jesus is meant to give us hope in our own experience:

"For the lost Friend [Jesus] did not come from just anywhere but from the night of death; and he passed through it! ... The disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. Today, at Pentecost, these words are also addressed to us, because in faith we can see him. In faith he comes among us and to us too he shows his hands and his side and we are glad. Therefore let us pray: Lord, show yourself! Make us the gift of your presence and we shall have the most beautiful gift: your joy." (Benedict XVI, Pentecost Homily 2011).
