We serve God by providing spiritual, educational, and social activities for our parish family as well as extending God's love and compassion to serve the greater community.



Dear Brothers and Sisters of Our Lady of Lourdes,

In this Sunday's Gospel, some people expressed their sadness over the unfair punishment and death of some other people of Galilee. In our own time, we may witness the unfair taking of life by those in powerful positions. As that point in history, "Pilate was sternly suppressing any sign of civil unrest." (Note to Luke 13:1, The Navarre Bible). In our own world, in of conflict and trouble – especially in Ukraine and Russia right now – we pray that the civilized discourse – and even civilized disagreement – will be protected.

In Jesus' time, the sadness was expressed not only for the death of the Galileans but also for the way that this punishment took place.

Dr. John Bergsma, of Franciscan University, wrote: "Jesus is rebuking a tendency among the Jews of his day, including his disciples, to see one's fate in death, whether favorable or unfavorable, as a divine assessment of the righteousness of one's life. In the kingdom of heaven, things are reversed. Those who die in persecution may in fact be 'blessed'. " (Matthew 5:10-12) (John Bergsma, The Word of the Lord, Steubenville, Ohio: Emmaus Road, 2021 p. 93)

The Lord gives us the supreme example of this, by accepting punishment and death on the cross, dying in an apparently sad and disgraceful way. Having died for your and my vices, we are the ones blessed with by Christ's vigilance and vigor. While his sacred head was surrounded by Roman soldiers and Pilate himself, Jesus gave up his life intentionally for our sins. Regarding our own view of eternal life – and when it starts -- we are also invited to a "reversal". Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, asked, "what is eternal life? " (Reference: Spe Salvi, "Saved In Hope" n. 10)

Benedict XVI wrote that what we often desire is not – eternal life – but that we want our present life to continue right now. Or in an even more extreme example, I want to go back in the past and limit some previous ideal age or time.

One way we learn true freedom is to learn the Gospel teaching on both life and death, living and dying. The Lord stated: "Blessed are they who mourn for they will be comforted." We don't want to simply want to avoid mourning. But we also need help in order to process our own experiences of dying and physical change. Pope Benedict writes that our lives are enriched by the understanding that we are moving towards death In this regard, the fact that we're going to die isn't simply a blind fate or a random act in the future.

This is training in true freedom, a recognition that we're not in charge and that we become a new person, by dying with Christ and rising to new life. And in this regard, we pray that for all of our loved ones, we pray that we will join them in eternal life as well.

I hope and pray that this Lenten Season helps you to know that God loves you, here and now and also for eternity, demonstrated in Jesus' gift of his life on the Cross.



A hand for labor. A hand for blessing. A hand for healing. A hand to show mercy. A hand that would restore to life. A hand that would be pierced (Psalm 22:16). A hand through which so much power and such tender love had flowed. "Jesus reached out his hand ...'

To the left of the main entrance of the University Chapel is the statue of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This image is a closeup of his pierced right hand. Each day thousands of students, faculty, priests, employees and visitors walk by this imposing marble figure, on their way to teach, to study, to work or to pray. Most would probably overlook the outstretched, wounded hand. But it is there. It remains. Open. Beckoning. Wounded. All for us. Jesus reaches out his hand to us - where we are, as we are. Because he wants us to know that he loves us and is with us. "Look at my hands ... it is really I" (Luke 24:39).

During this holy season of Lent, we remember Jesus' hands. They embraced the world as He hung upon the Cross. They reach out to us still - cradling us in our troubled time in such need of peace, of healing and of God's tender love. In His hands we remain safe and secure.

Prayer:

Jesus, through your hands, help us to receive blessing, courage and strength. By your hands, may we find the healing of all of our wounds - as individuals and as a human family. In your hands, may find comfort, peace and life in our day and into eternity. Amen.
