Dear Friends,

I write to extend my gratitude for your prayers and support of our life in Christ together, especially during the current crisis in the Church after allegations against former Archbishop Theodore McCarrick and clergy and church leaders in Pennsylvania. Your faith is inspiring.

Recent News: June 20, 2018 & August 14, 2018

You have heard of the allegations of abuse against Archbishop McCarrick, formerly of Newark, on June 20th. Then, on August 14th, the State of Pennsylvania's grand jury report showed a heartbreaking departure from our fundamental belief in the dignity and value of every child. Please pray for the victims of abuse and for the pursuit of justice.

Evening Prayer Services + Friday September 7 + Friday September 14

At this time, we need not only human wisdom but also the light of prayer and contemplation to remember our need for Christ's sacrifice and example. He goes to the Cross, demonstrating that the weakness of God is stronger than human strength and the foolishness of God wiser than human wisdom. The cathedral service on Friday September 14th, at 7:30 pm is Cardinal Tobin's invitation to an Evening of Penance and Prayer, in reparation for and healing of all those impacted by the abuse crisis. Cardinal Tobin encourages us to make September 14 a day of fast and abstinence, similar to our Good Friday observance.

The church at Lourdes is open on September 14 for those who may not be able to be in Newark. I share with you recent statements of Pope Francis and Cardinal Tobin, about our prayer and discipleship at this time (below):

Pope Francis: "[We are called to] see things as the Lord does, to be where the Lord wants us to be, to experience a conversion of heart in his presence. To do so, prayer and penance will help. I invite the entire holy faithful People of God to a penitential exercise of prayer and fasting, following the Lord's command. (Matthew 17:21) This can awaken our conscience and arouse our solidarity and commitment to a culture of care that says "never again" to every form of abuse."
