#### Dear Friends,

**EVERYDAY ASHES**. How do "dust and ashes" show up in our lives? Just as the mud or dirt of a physical endeavor (or sporting event or military battle) signifies the initiation of a struggle, the ashes on Ash Wednesday indicate the beginning of a 40-day spiritual struggle.

The ashes symbolize genuine change. Monsignor Charles Pope asserts that true repentance involves a sincere intent to change rather than a mere outward display. Merely receiving ashes without a commitment to change renders them a false sign. (Catholic Standard, "5 Meanings of Ashes We Receive Today" https://cathstan.org/posts/fivemeanings-of-the-ashes-we-receive-today-3)

**GOSPEL**. The Gospel of Ash Wednesday reminds us that genuine change transcends appearances, discouraging superficiality and hypocrisy: "When you fast, do not look gloomy like the <u>hypocrites</u>. They neglect their appearance, <u>so that</u> <u>they may appear to others to be fasting</u>. Amen, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you fast, <u>anoint</u> <u>your head and wash your face, so that you may not appear</u> <u>to be fasting</u>, except to your Father who is hidden. And your Father who sees what is hidden will repay you." (Matthew 6:16-18)

**<u>PENANCE</u>**. Penance, which is really not confined to the 40 days of Lent, extends to positive actions throughout the year. Penance, associated with the sacrament of Confession and Reconciliation, serves not to earn forgiveness but to recognize and receive God's grace.

St. Paul compares our lives and bodies to "houses" and "Temples" of the Holy Spirit. Penance, in this context, is not about renouncing inherently bad things but giving up something good as a means of uniting with God. I would like to share some examples, based on the 3 traditional practices of Lent – FASTING – PRAYER – ALMSGIVING (CHARITY). **FASTING AND CALORIES**. These could be small sacrifices made at the table, such as abstaining from sugar in coffee or tea. We can undertake small acts inconspicuously, with the goal of self-discipline and spiritual growth.

**PRAYER AND COMMUNICATION**. How can you and I "sacrifice" on communication? One way is to set time limits on phone/computer use. It's a virtue to see clearly faces of loved ones at the table, to talk and put down the phone!

A "communication" sacrifice could call us to reduce our inclination to complex and verbose explanations. Do I say too much? Sometimes! Giving my perspective from the heart is good, but I also need to allow honesty to speak for itself. Then, I can better listen to and pray for my neighbor, family member, friend, coworker.

In the Gospel Jesus cautions us about making complicated or elaborate oaths or promises (Matthew 5: 33-37). Rather, state and speak the truth clearly: "Let your yes mean yes and your no mean no" (Matthew 5:37).

Thomas Merton wrote about how to be sincere and serene: "[Why do we get angry about what we believe? Because we do not really believe it. Or else what we pretend to be defending as the "truth" is really our own self-esteem. [A person] of sincerity is less interested in defending the truth than in stating it clearly." (Thomas Merton, "Sincerity" essay, <u>No Man is an</u> <u>Island</u> book, p. 195)

<u>ALMSGIVING AND COMFORT</u>. Living at ease and without pain is good. Yet, at times, does love not strain both the muscle and mind? It is easy to stretch ourselves when our beloved is reciprocating. However, Jesus said do not love only those who love you: love your enemy. (Matthew 5:43)

In times of conflict with another, we may be called to give back, or change places with someone or imagine what another person is feeling. This "reversal of roles" is easy when we are *simpatico* and connected emotionally. When we are at odds with someone, it is harder walk in the other's shoes. It is also harder to take the "back seat" when you know a right or privilege is due to you. This is love.

(PASTOR COLUMN continued from Page 2 Are there ways in which you or I can change "seats" or "places" with others throughout the day in order to give up something good out of love? On the plane, the train, or automobile, this might mean moving to the "middle seat" for the sake of someone else. You may have done this, and no one noticed. In Gospel terms, you did not "appear to be fasting." But God noticed and is always looking beyond appearances. I pray this Lent, which began on February 14 - Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day - may remind us of God's love for you. The ashes on our foreheads symbolize not only the beginning of a struggle but also an opportunity for genuine, inward transformation.
