Lenten Reflection on 1st Reading from Exodus Chapter 3

1.Moses and the Burning Bush In Exodus, chapter 3, Moses is in the desert, alone and accustomed to his independent ways. He is probably used to building his own fires, navigating the wilderness as a resident-shepherd. Yet now, he encounters a fire he did not build—a fire within a bush that is not consumed by flames. As an experienced wanderer, Moses is curious about this unusual sight. His curiosity draws him closer to the mystery.

2. Curiosity During Lent In our 40 days of Lent, we are similarly invited into curiosity and exploration. While repentance and humility are core aspects of our journey, so too are imagination and creativity about where God is present. Like Moses, who relied on his creative instincts to survive the desert, we are called to examine the deeper meaning of the moments we encounter. What is happening at the fire scene? What is God revealing to us through our experiences?

<u>3. Moses' Struggle with His Calling</u> This fire becomes the place from which Moses desires to escape. God calls him to confront Pharaoh and rescue the Hebrew people from slavery, but Moses resists. During this divine "interview," Moses voices his doubts:

Pharaoh won't believe me (therefore... escape the fire).

Pharaoh's army is too strong (therefore... escape the fire).

I am not eloquent; I struggle to speak publicly (therefore... escape the fire).

Moses initially hesitates to believe in his mission. He would likely question the message of the Psalm: "Your word is a lamp for my steps and a light for my path" (Psalm 119:105). His journey to embrace his calling is gradual, reflecting the human struggle to accept God's purpose.

4. The Fire of Self-Examination Fires invite investigation, but in this case, Moses himself is the subject of investigation. Likewise, during Lent, we are called into a period of examination. It is not a time to fear what we might uncover, but a time to discover deeper truths within ourselves. Lent is an opportunity to ask: What is God igniting within me? What transformation is unfolding?

5. Encountering God in Stillness One of our spiritual practices is to sit before the Lord, just as Moses encountered God at the burning bush. We can enter this encounter by sitting in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, imitating Moses and Jesus in Gethsemane. In this sacred stillness, we open ourselves to prayer and listening, allowing God to speak and kindle a fire within us. Through these personal moments of reflection, we deepen our relationship with Christ and invite His transformative presence into our lives.


